#3 "Its not just good for the children its better for the teachers" Strengths:

- You've considered multiple perspectives
- You're thinking about broader benefits

Weakness: Limited development of teacher benefits \rightarrow Your argument lacks specific examples of how teachers would use this time effectively. The sentence is missing apostrophes and proper

punctuation, which weakens your message. You need to expand on how teachers would benefit professionally.

Exemplar: "It's not only beneficial for students, but it's also valuable for teachers, who could use this extra time to prepare engaging lessons and provide better support for our learning."

- Your writing shows great potential in addressing an important issue. You need to organise your ideas more clearly and provide specific examples to support each point. Try to develop your arguments further by explaining why each benefit matters. Your letter would be more persuasive if you included real examples from your school day.
- Most importantly, you have to work on your sentence structure, such as proper punctuation placement. Check the edits below for reference/.
