

Section 1:

Strengths:

- Creates an immersive opening scene with sensory details
- Effectively conveys the narrator's emotional connection to the setting

Weaknesses: Run-on Sentences → Your opening contains multiple independent clauses without proper punctuation. The lack of punctuation makes it difficult to follow the narrative flow. For instance, "It was a warm summer day" and "I stepped in the field of daisies" should be separate thoughts.

Exemplar: "It was a warm summer day. As I stepped into the field of daisies and pushed the gate behind me, I felt a sense of excitement run down my spine—I knew this was where I was meant to be."

#2: "As I washed the dogs smooth fur bubbles floated up in the bright sky making a reflection of the rescue centre."

Strengths:

- Incorporates visual imagery with the bubbles floating
- Links the action to the setting effectively

Weaknesses: Missing Punctuation → Your sentence lacks essential punctuation marks that would help clarify the relationship between ideas. The description of washing the dogs' fur and the bubbles floating needs proper separation.

Exemplar: "As I washed the dogs' smooth fur, bubbles floated up in the bright sky, creating a reflection of the rescue centre."

#3: "but when I came to feed the cat it looked much more bigger then i realised it was a older cat so I fed some food him as well."

Strengths:

- Shows thoughtful observation of the animal
- Demonstrates care and adaptability in the narrator's actions

Weaknesses: Sentence Structure → Your sentence combines multiple thoughts without proper coordination. The comparison of the cat's size and the realisation of its age needs clearer organisation.

Exemplar: "When I returned to feed the cat, I noticed it was much bigger than I had initially thought. Realising it was an older cat, I gave it some food as well."

Actionable Task: Rewrite your piece focusing on proper sentence breaks and punctuation. Take each long sentence and divide it into smaller, clearer thoughts whilst maintaining your descriptive style.
