Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Strong opening that immediately captures attention with location and event
- Clear scene-setting that helps listeners visualise the unique situation

Section 2:

Host (Jim Johnson): Good evening, listeners. There is something extraordinary happening here. It is that [Something extraordinary is happening here:] a Brazilian Carnival is taking place.
