#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Your opening hook effectively poses a question to engage the audience
- Your writing establishes clear context about white paper's formal uses

#3 (Last paragraph) Strengths:

Weaknesses: Limited conclusion → Your final paragraph simply lists previous points without adding new insight. Phrases like "it has so many benefits" and "it is the greatest colour" need specific examples to be more convincing.
