Strengths:

Weaknesses: Lack of sentence structure \rightarrow Your entry is one long sentence listing different creatures. Break it up to make it easier to read and more impactful.

 Missing emotional reaction → You mention being "under attack" but don't share your feelings about these dangerous creatures.

Strengths:
