Section 1:

#1: (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Strong opening hook with the mysterious golden key discovery
- Vivid description of the magical elements like the glowing star and floating key

Weakness: Limited build-up of suspense \rightarrow Your writing moves too quickly from finding the key to entering the magical world. The phrase "I did not know what else would be and I had no one with me so I opened the door" rushes through an opportunity to create tension and anticipation.

Exemplar: I stared at the threatening note, my heart pounding. The empty park suddenly felt eerie, and I debated whether to use the key or walk away.

#2: (Second paragraph) Strengths:

- Creative problem-solving with the enlargement spell
- Good use of dialogue with the knights

Weakness: Underdeveloped character interaction \rightarrow Your conversation with the knights lacks depth. The line "you sound like you want to steal the princess" could be expanded to show more interaction between the characters.

Exemplar: The knights exchanged suspicious glances, their armour gleaming in the sunlight. "Your accents betray you," the tallest one declared, "No noble lady would speak as you do."

#3: (Fourth paragraph) Strengths:

- Exciting chase scene at the end
- Good use of direct speech between characters

Weakness: Rushed ending \rightarrow Your conclusion feels hurried. The phrase "that was definitely enough of a adventure" doesn't fully wrap up all the magical elements and mysteries introduced earlier.

Exemplar: As we caught our breath beneath the familiar tree, I fingered the magical key in my pocket, wondering if we'd ever understand the true purpose of our unexpected journey.

■ Your story has wonderful magical elements and creative ideas, but you could make your readers feel more connected to the adventure by adding more details about how you and Bella felt during

key moments. Try spending more time describing your reactions to the magical creatures and the castle's wonders. You could also make your story stronger by explaining why the princess was there and what the magical key's real purpose was.

Actionable task: Rewrite the scene where you first meet the princess, focusing on building suspense and adding details about why she seems familiar to Bella. Also, make sure to polish your writing by working on the grammatical aspects. Fix your punctuation errors as well.
