#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Your creative opening using time travel captures attention effectively
- Your clear statement of purpose establishes the speech's focus

Weaknesses: Issue: Underdeveloped hook \rightarrow Your time traveller premise needs more specific details about 2060's environmental impact. The phrase "impacted greatly" is too vague and misses an opportunity to paint a vivid picture of future consequences.

#2 (Second paragraph) Strengths:

- Your clear listing of climate change effects
- Your good contrast between present and future

Weaknesses: Issue: Lack of supporting evidence → Your statement "choices people make" needs specific examples. You list consequences but don't connect them to human actions. The phrase "difficult to understand" doesn't lead effectively into your main points.

Exemplar: "While you see vibrant nature today, specific human choices—like burning fossil fuels and cutting down forests—are already changing our planet. These actions trigger climate change, leading to rising temperatures, higher seas, severe droughts, and the extinction of precious species."

#3 (Third paragraph) Strengths:

- Your positive, solution-focused approach
- Your emphasis on simplicity of action

Weaknesses: Issue: Oversimplified solution \rightarrow Your presentation of recycling oversimplifies the solution. The phrase "pick up pieces of rubbish on the floor" reduces recycling to litter collection, missing crucial aspects like sorting materials and reducing consumption.

Exemplar: "Recycling is a powerful way to help our environment. By carefully sorting our paper, plastic, and metal waste, we reduce pollution and protect wildlife. Start by separating your rubbish at home—every item recycled helps heal our planet."

■ Your speech needs more depth in explaining how individual actions connect to larger environmental impacts. You could strengthen your argument by providing specific examples of how recycling helps and including other concrete actions besides just picking up litter. Your imagery of future wildlife is lovely, but you need to build a stronger bridge between present actions and future outcomes. Try adding more details about the changes happening between the 1980s and 2060.
