#1: First paragraph Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details in describing the festival atmosphere
- Creative use of descriptive language to build anticipation

Weaknesses: Run-on sentences \rightarrow Your opening paragraph contains multiple ideas joined incorrectly with "and". The phrase "Well today I got some news for you" breaks the flow of your imaginative description.

#2: Second paragraph Strengths:
