Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Clear topic introduction with a definitive stance
- Good use of transition words to connect ideas

#2 (Second paragraph) Strengths:

Exemplar: For instance, when writing with red ink on green paper, the text appears muddy and strains the eyes, while the same red ink on white paper remains sharp and perfectly legible.

#3 (Last paragraph) Strengths:

- Strong concluding statement
- Good summary of main points

Weaknesses: Issue: Weak conclusion structure  $\rightarrow$  Your conclusion simply restates points without reinforcing the argument. The phrase "I'm sure that we can all agree" doesn't provide a compelling final thought.

Exemplar: Having demonstrated white paper's superior readability, professional appearance, and cost-effectiveness, it's clear that white A4 paper is the most practical and versatile choice for all our writing needs.
