#1 Strengths:

- Clear opening statement introducing the main topic of white paper
- Good use of comparison to establish your point

Weaknesses: Repetitive statements without development → You repeat "white is just the perfect coloured paper" and "white coloured paper is best" without explaining why. The comparisons to other colours are too simple and need more detail about how they affect writing or drawing.

Exemplar: *White paper provides the perfect backdrop for any artistic creation, offering a clean canvas that makes every colour stand out beautifully.*

#2 Strengths:

- Practical consideration of cost
- Clear comparison between paper types

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped argument structure → Your point about cost jumps suddenly from the previous topic of colours. The sentences are too short and choppy. "That is ridiculous" needs more support to explain why spending money on coloured paper is not wise.

Exemplar: *Blue paper costs significantly more than white paper, making it an impractical choice for everyday use, especially when you need lots of paper for schoolwork.*

#3 Strengths:

- Good practical example with maths problems
- Clear conclusion of your argument

Weaknesses: Limited explanation and abrupt ending → Your point about maths problems needs more detail about why white paper helps with calculations. The final sentence makes a strong claim but doesn't summarise your earlier points about cost and usability.

Exemplar: *When solving maths problems, white paper allows you to see your calculations clearly, making it easier to spot mistakes and show your working out step by step.*

→ Your writing presents a clear preference for white paper, but needs more detailed explanations. You can make your writing stronger by giving specific examples of when you use white paper and how it helps you. Try to connect your ideas better - move from talking about art to cost to maths in a smoother way. Add more details about why each colour creates problems for different activities.

Actionable task: Rewrite your piece focusing on one specific activity (like drawing or maths) and explain in detail why white paper works best for that activity, including examples from your experience. Make sure to develop your ideas further and add more details because your piece is quite concise. You can
