Strengths:

- Your vivid description of the weather creates a strong sensory image

Weaknesses: Redundancy \rightarrow You repeat "arrived" twice in consecutive sentences and mention "hotel" three times in close proximity. This makes your writing feel repetitive and reduces its impact.

Exemplar: Exhausted and dripping with sweat in Singapore's humid weather, I finally reached my destination - the luxurious Raffles hotel, its grand facade teeming with visitors.

#2: "The room looked big, until I found out that inside the colourful wardrobe was a shiny metal door with the words 'come in please' taped on it."

Strengths:

- Your introduction of mystery creates intrigue
- Your descriptive details help readers visualise the scene

Weaknesses: Abrupt transition \rightarrow You jump from describing the room to discovering the door without building tension or explaining your exploration. "until I found out" feels rushed and doesn't engage readers fully.

Exemplar: As I explored my spacious room, something unusual caught my eye - inside the colourful wardrobe, a mysterious shiny metal door bore a handwritten note saying 'come in please'.

#3: "The son was shocked that his toy still looked new, and it was a long time before the manager let me go back to my room., which seemed like the incident took a day, but it just took forty-five minutes."

Strengths:

- Your inclusion of time elements adds perspective
- Your resolution brings closure to the mystery

Weaknesses: Unclear sequence \rightarrow Your writing combines multiple events without clear transitions. The punctuation and structure make it difficult to follow the sequence of events.

Exemplar: The son was amazed to see his childhood toy in pristine condition after so many years. Though the whole incident lasted just forty-five minutes, it felt much longer as we waited for the manager's permission to leave.

 \rightarrow Your writing presents an interesting discovery at a famous hotel, but needs more development in setting the scene and building suspense. You could expand on the characters' reactions and emotions throughout the story. Your transitions between events need smoothing out to help readers follow the story more easily. Consider adding more descriptive details about the hotel's atmosphere and the characters' personalities.

Actionable task: Rewrite the wardrobe discovery scene, focusing on building suspense through your careful exploration of the room and emotional reaction to finding the mysterious door.
