However, the story would benefit from more balanced pacing. The beginning moves slowly with detailed descriptions, while the ending feels rushed with quick violent actions. You could improve the middle section by adding more detail about the illegal settlers and their motivations. Also, try to show Leonardo's feelings through his actions rather than telling us directly about his fears. Your dialogue needs more back-and-forth between characters to make their interactions feel real. Adding small details about how characters move or speak would make them more alive to readers.
