#1 (First paragraph): Strengths:

- Strong scene-setting with vivid details about the village and mountain
- Clear establishment of the main conflict and contrasting characters

Weakness: Limited character background → Your introduction of Jason and Mason lacks depth in their relationship history. The phrase "Jason and Mason were not friends" needs more context about why they weren't friends and their past interactions in the village. #2 (Third paragraph): Strengths:

Weakness: Underdeveloped transformation \rightarrow Your description of the cave scene lacks detail about how Mason's guilt led to his decision. The transition from "Mason feels guilty" to offering the food needs more development of his thought process. Exemplar: As Jason's tears fell, Mason remembered how it felt to be pulled from certain death. Perhaps, he thought, survival wasn't just about saving yourself.

■ Your narrative has a compelling foundation but needs more emotional depth. You could enhance the story by showing more of the characters' thoughts and feelings throughout their journey. Additionally, try adding more details about how the harsh environment affects their changing relationship. You might also expand on their interactions during the two-day journey you mentioned. Focus on developing the scenes where their attitudes towards each other begin to

shift. The ending feels rather quick - consider showing specific examples of how their life lessons manifested after returning to the village. Your dialogue could be more detailed to reveal character personalities better.
