Section 1:

#1: "Hello everyone. I hope you can understand me as the last time I checked the language in the 1980's it was English. Now, I am not here to give you a lecture on recycling, but am to show you what it will do to the planet you call home."

Strengths:

- Your opening creates an engaging, conversational tone that draws readers in
- Your clear statement of purpose helps establish the speech's direction

Weaknesses: Ineffective Hook \rightarrow Your opening relies on dated humour that detracts from the serious nature of your topic. The reference to "1980's" and checking the language feels disconnected from your environmental message.

Exemplar: "Our planet stands at a crossroads, and today I'm here to show you how your actions will shape its future - the place we all call home."

#2: "This situation wasn't science fiction. It was reality. Earth became unable to succumb to any form of life and we had to migrate."

Strengths:

- Your use of short, impactful sentences creates dramatic emphasis
- Your transition from narrative to reality effectively reinforces your message

Weaknesses: Logical Inconsistency \rightarrow Your narrative jumps from describing a future scenario to claiming it as present reality. The phrase "Earth became unable to succumb to any form of life" contradicts the fact that you're describing a potential future.

Exemplar: "This isn't merely science fiction - it's the reality we're hurtling towards unless we act now. Our Earth is showing signs of becoming increasingly hostile to life."

#3: "Now you see this man, he is strolling through the streets and sees a piece of rubbish. What should he do? Pick it up or leave it."

Strengths:

- Your interactive approach engages the audience directly
- Your use of a concrete example makes the message relatable

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped Scenario \rightarrow Your example lacks context and emotional weight. The simple binary choice doesn't fully illustrate the complexity of environmental responsibility.

Exemplar: "Imagine you're walking down your street and spot a plastic bottle in the gutter. That single piece of rubbish represents a choice - a choice that, multiplied by billions of people, shapes our planet's future."

Actionable Task: Rewrite your opening paragraph focusing on creating a stronger emotional connection with your audience. Replace the dated language reference with a compelling fact or scenario about environmental change that directly affects your listeners' lives.
