## **WRITING PIECE 1**

### Section 1:

#1: "Lucas was ambling upon the rippling dunes... breathtaking scenery" Strengths:

- Vivid sensory details create a strong visual atmosphere
- Effective use of descriptive language to set the scene

Weakness: Time inconsistency  $\rightarrow$  Your writing shifts between past and present timeframes. The phrase "before he had to return at sunset" conflicts with "It was shortly after dusk," creating confusion about when events occur.

Exemplar: It was shortly after dusk, and Lucas knew he should have returned to the shelter hours ago. Above him, amber clouds painted the darkening sky.

#2: "In his cold, bare hands... residents to read it to me" Strengths:

- Good build-up of mystery with the bottle discovery
- Natural integration of character thoughts

Weakness: Unclear character knowledge  $\rightarrow$  Your narrative mentions "Lucas didn't know what it was called" regarding a glass bottle, but then shows him recognising writing on streets, which seems mismatched with his knowledge level.

Exemplar: Lucas held the smooth glass bottle in his trembling hands, studying its unfamiliar shape. The paper inside bore markings similar to those he'd seen around the city - letters he wished he could understand.

#3: "Lucas' mind envisioned... memory of his mother" Strengths:

- Powerful emotional backstory revelation
- Effective use of flashback technique

Weakness: Rushed emotional development  $\rightarrow$  Your flashback sequence moves too quickly between different memories without fully developing their emotional impact. The transition from "fine linen cloth" to "midnight black" needs more connection.

Exemplar: The memory washed over Lucas like a wave - first came the softness of his baby blanket, then the crushing darkness of that final night. His mother's desperate cries still echoed in his mind as she thrust the suitcase towards him.

■ Your narrative presents an intriguing story about family inheritance and self-discovery. You could enhance the emotional depth by spending more time exploring Lucas's feelings about his past and present situation. The ending feels quite sudden - try expanding on how Lucas processes this life-changing discovery and what it means for his future.

Actionable task: Rewrite the flashback paragraph focusing on one specific memory, ensuring you capture Lucas's emotional journey through detailed sensory descriptions and his internal thoughts.

### Strengths:

- Builds tension effectively through time reference
- Shows character's emotional state through internal thoughts

Weakness: Limited character emotion development  $\rightarrow$  Your writing moves quickly through Liam's feelings without showing deeper emotional impact. Phrases like "his forebodings became worse" need more detail.

Exemplar: After a brief rest, Liam arrived at the festival, his heart growing heavier with each tick of the clock. As midnight approached, dread filled his chest - he alone knew what terror awaited the unsuspecting villagers.

#3: "But Liam, a shepherd wearing ragged clothes, who had seen the phenomenon for many years, nervously stood in front of the distressed residents to try to explain it."

## Strengths:

- Shows character growth through brave action
- Contrasts his humble status with his important role

Weakness: Quick resolution  $\rightarrow$  Your ending rushes through the climactic moment. The phrase "try to explain it" doesn't show us what he actually says or how he calms the crowd.

Exemplar: Despite his worn appearance, Liam found the courage to face the panicked crowd. Drawing from years of solitary observation, he shared his knowledge of the sky's predictable pattern, his quiet voice steady and reassuring.

■ Your narrative presents an intriguing premise about a mysterious natural phenomenon, but needs deeper exploration of your character's emotional journey. Consider developing Liam's relationship with the village and his feelings about being the sole keeper of this knowledge. Adding more sensory details about the night market festival would help readers feel more immersed in the scene.

Actionable Task: Rewrite the final paragraph focusing on Liam's specific words to the crowd and their gradual shift from panic to understanding.
