My great grandfather would recover fully, no longer troubled by complications from his extra kidney. Dr James's shoulders relaxed as he accepted our heartfelt thanks—this successful surgery had clearly boosted his confidence as a surgeon.

Your writing shows promise with its emotional core and interesting medical scenario. However, you need to develop more depth in your storytelling by adding sensory details and realistic medical information. The hospital setting offers a rich opportunity to engage readers with specific details about sounds, smells, and sights typical of such environments rather than general statements.

Also, try to make your characters more three-dimensional. While Dr James is enthusiastic and skilful, we don't learn much about his background or what makes him special as a surgeon. Similarly, your great grandfather remains mostly undefined beyond his medical condition.

Additionally, consider building tension more effectively throughout your narrative. Rather than simply stating "we had to wait for hours and hours," describe what happened during that waiting period—the anxiety, conversations, or small moments that reveal character.

Your ending would benefit from greater emotional resonance. How did this experience change your relationship with your great grandfather? What lasting impression did Dr James leave on your family?
