# **□** WRITING PIECE 1 - FEEDBACK

#### Section 1:

#1: "I strongly believe that, no, kids should not have unlimited screen time. In fact, they should have carefully managed and constant restrictions as this will allow and encourage better sleep, foster creativity, encourage physical activity, reduce the risk of addiction and improve social skills and academic performance."

# Strengths:

- Clear position statement showing your stance
- Good use of linking ideas with multiple benefits

Weaknesses: Run-on sentence  $\rightarrow$  Your opening contains too many ideas joined together, making it hard to follow. The sentence structure needs breaking down to emphasise each important point.

I strongly believe children should not have unlimited screen time. Instead, they need carefully managed restrictions. These limits will encourage better sleep, foster creativity, and improve both physical activity and academic performance.

#2: "Without the implementation of boundaries, unchecked and excessive use of screen time will lead to eye strain, poor posture, obesity, sleep problems, addiction, anxiety, stress, shortened attention span leading to horrible academic performance, aggressive and violent behaviour, less family time and poor communication."

## Strengths:

- Comprehensive list of consequences
- Strong emotional appeal

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped ideas  $\rightarrow$  Your points are listed without proper development or connections between them. The issues are simply stated without showing how they link to screen time.

Additionally, you can make your writing more convincing by adding your own experiences or examples from daily life. Your conclusion needs to remind readers about your main points and give them something to think about.

Section 2:

- #3 Time away from screen will promote better creativity and imaginative activities such as, drawing, writing and problem solving. [Time away from screens encourages children to explore creative activities. Through drawing, writing, and problem-solving tasks, children develop their imagination and thinking skills.]

Limiting screen time will improve sleep quality by reducing the impact of blue light on melatonin production. Better sleep allows kids to focus on homework study in school performance as well as having more opportunities to interact with family members and peers, strengthening communication and social skills. Reduced screen time protects mental health by preventing anxiety, addiction, depression and low self-esteem. It's important to find the right balance between screen time and other activities that encourage healthy growing and development. Having limits helps kids have self-discipline, be active and stimulate social interactions.

## **□** WRITING PIECE 2 - FEEDBACK

## Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph) Strengths:

- Strong opening statement that clearly states your position
- Effective use of emotional appeal through vivid descriptions of environmental impact

Weaknesses: Underdeveloped argument  $\rightarrow$  Your opening statement would be more impactful if you provided context about why plastic has become such a prevalent issue. The phrase "without a shadow of a doubt" comes across as too forceful without supporting background information.

Exemplar: Plastic has become an environmental crisis that threatens our planet's future, and its continued use poses devastating consequences for all living things.

#2 (Second paragraph, description of animal impact) Strengths:

- Powerful examples of specific animals affected
- Clear cause-and-effect relationships explained

Weaknesses: Limited perspective  $\rightarrow$  Your focus solely on marine animals limits the scope of your argument. Phrases like "unimaginable harm" could be supported with examples from land animals and other ecosystems too.

Exemplar: From sea turtles choking on plastic bags to birds tangled in fishing lines, and even land animals trapped in discarded containers, wildlife everywhere faces dire consequences from our plastic waste.

#3 (Final paragraph) Strengths:

- Good presentation of alternatives to plastic
- Strong call to action

Weaknesses: Rushed conclusion  $\rightarrow$  Your ending feels hurried with phrases like "We must act now" without explaining practical steps. The alternatives are listed quickly without explaining their benefits.

Exemplar: Paper bags decompose naturally within months, while bamboo products offer durability without environmental harm. By choosing these alternatives, we can significantly reduce plastic pollution.

■ Your persuasive piece shows passion for environmental protection, which helps engage readers emotionally. However, you could strengthen your argument by explaining why previous attempts

to reduce plastic use haven't worked. Also, consider discussing how different groups (governments, businesses, individuals) can work together to implement a plastic ban. Additionally, you might want to explore the economic impact of banning plastic and how communities can adapt. Your second paragraph could include more examples of successful plastic bans in other places. The final paragraph needs more specific steps readers can take today to reduce plastic use. You could also add how schools and families can work together to decrease plastic waste.

Section 2:

#1 Without a shadow of a doubt, plastic should absolutely be banned – for the sake of the entire planet and all living things. Every year, millions of tonnes of plastic has been discarded [Every year, millions of tonnes of plastic are discarded] and left in our oceans, lakes, rivers and

landscapes, suffocating life and poisoning our eco-systems.

## Section 1:

#1 "There are numerous reasons why learning at school is superior at home – the organized schedule, interaction with other students, accessibility to resources, encouragement and motivation and assistance from teachers and staff."

## Strengths:

- Clear topic sentence introducing multiple supporting points
- Good use of specific examples to support the main argument

Weakness: Run-on sentence structure  $\rightarrow$  Your sentence combines too many ideas without proper punctuation or connecting words, making it hard to follow. The phrase "superior at home" needs "to learning" for clarity.

Exemplar: Learning at school is superior to learning at home for numerous reasons: it provides an organized schedule, enables interaction with other students, offers access to resources, and provides encouragement and support from teachers and staff.

#2 "Learning at home is eminently distracting, finites challenges for students who are advanced, narrows feedback, increased isolation and lacks time constraint."

## Strengths:

- Attempts to present multiple counterarguments
- Uses sophisticated vocabulary

Weakness: Unclear logical flow  $\rightarrow$  Your points lack proper connection and some terms are used incorrectly. "Finites challenges" is not clear, and the sentence structure doesn't maintain consistency.

Exemplar: Home learning can be highly distracting, limits challenges for advanced students, provides less feedback, increases isolation, and often lacks proper time management.

#3 "This lambastes students making them feel depression, anxiety, frustration, distress, anguished, dismayed and dejection."

### Strengths:

- Shows awareness of emotional impact
- Attempts to use varied vocabulary

Weakness: Word choice confusion  $\rightarrow$  Your use of "lambastes" is incorrect in this context, and the emotional states are not properly structured grammatically.

Exemplar: These challenges can negatively affect students, leading to feelings of depression, anxiety, frustration, and distress.

■ Your piece shows good potential in arguing for traditional schooling, but needs more development in several areas. The introduction would benefit from a clearer thesis statement that directly states your position. Also, you could strengthen your arguments by giving specific examples of how school activities benefit students. Additionally, try to organise your ideas into clear paragraphs, with each paragraph focusing on one main point. Your emotional impact section needs better structure - try listing the benefits of school-based learning in a more organised way. You could improve the flow by adding transition words between your points. Finally, work on making your conclusion stronger by restating your main arguments and ending with a powerful closing statement.

### Section 2:
