Should Homework be Banned?

#1 Homework. Just a cruel invention. [Homework is an outdated educational practice.] It takes time away from your relaxing time. It makes you work after six hours of blithering schoolwork. [It forces additional work after an already full day of lessons.] The worst part is, it's not even necessary, and yet it still continues to be in everyone's education.
