What kinds of benefits are you referring to, and how do they last a lifetime? Adding more details would make your argument stronger.
- c. Exemplar: "Learning a musical instrument in childhood has been linked to lasting benefits such as enhanced memory, creativity, and emotional regulation skills, highlighting the importance of making this opportunity accessible to all students."

Your persuasive piece does a good job of highlighting the potential benefits of learning a musical instrument, particularly for children's cognitive development and mental wellbeing. Additionally, your use of vivid language helps to engage the reader and make your argument more compelling. However, to strengthen your piece further, you could focus on providing more specific examples and evidence to support your claims. Also, while the figurative language is creative, be careful not to overuse it at the expense of clarity and substance. Try to strike a balance between making your writing engaging and ensuring that your main points are clear and well-supported. Finally, consider expanding on the idea that everyone should have the opportunity to learn an instrument, perhaps by addressing potential barriers or counterarguments.
