Strengths: Your ending effectively creates a cliffhanger that suggests a sequel. The short final sentence adds dramatic impact.

Try including conversations between Raymond and townspeople to show their strange behaviour rather than simply telling us they've changed. The setting needs more specific details to help readers picture this community. The villain's motivation is unclear—why does the government want to control minds? Finally, the resolution happens too quickly without enough obstacles for Raymond to overcome. Create more challenges before he succeeds to increase the satisfaction readers feel when he finally wins.
