#2 Strengths: Your enthusiasm about the environmental benefits shows your understanding of ecosystems. You consider both fauna and flora in your observations.

Weakness: Detail development  $\rightarrow$  You mention "lots of different types of fish" and "fauna who need a drink" but don't provide specific examples. This creates a general rather than specific image. The section about animals needing water repeats the same idea without adding new information.

Exemplar: Not only was this good for ending the drought, but it created a thriving habitat. Tiny silver minnows darted beneath the surface while a family of kangaroos cautiously approached the water's edge for their first proper drink in months.

#3 Strengths: Your personal connection to witnessing the transformation is authentic and heartfelt. The excitement builds as you observe changes over time.

Weakness: Repetitive language  $\rightarrow$  You use "filled with excitement" and variations of being "filled" with emotion several times in quick succession. For example: "I was filled with excitement cheering and cheering over and over again I was filled and overflowed with happiness." This repetition reduces the impact of your emotional response.

Exemplar: Astonishment washed over me as I watched these once-withered plants stand tall and strong. My heart raced with joy. This barren wasteland had transformed into something more wonderful than I could have imagined.

Your narrative captures genuine excitement about environmental recovery, which is compelling. To strengthen your piece, try varying your sentence structures—mix shorter sentences with longer ones to create rhythm. When describing the transformation, include more specific details about what you observed, such as particular plants or animals. Also, expand on why this miracle matters beyond the immediate benefits. What does this transformation teach us about resilience or hope? Consider organising your thoughts into clearer paragraphs that follow a timeline: before the rain, during the rain, and the gradual transformation afterwards. Additionally, your conclusion invites reader engagement, which works well, but you could strengthen it by connecting your personal miracle to broader environmental themes.
