



Submit formal applications to multiple schools (recommended 5-10 schools). Most applications require a fee of approximately \$200 per school. Step 3: Examination

Sit the Academic Assessment Services (ACER) or Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) scholarship examination, which tests English, mathematics,


