#1 (First paragraph of the letter): Strengths: Your emotive language effectively conveys passion for the library. The metaphors comparing the library to "wisdom" and "thoughts and dreams" create a strong emotional appeal. Weakness: Sentence structure and clarity. \rightarrow Your opening sentence is a run-on sentence with confusing logic. The phrase "will not be replaced by a shopping mall" actually contradicts your concern (you mean it *will* be replaced). The dramatic opening would be more effective with clearer structure and precise wording. Exemplar: It is with a heavy heart and profound concern that I write regarding our beloved library—a sanctuary of wisdom, thoughts, and dreams—which now faces replacement by a shopping mall designed merely for temporary amusement.

#2 (Third paragraph): Strengths: Personal connection effectively strengthens your argument. You've created a sense of community by referencing shared experiences. Weakness: Metaphor consistency and development. \rightarrow You begin with describing yourself as a "victim of the library's nurturing care," which presents a contradictory image. The metaphors shift rapidly between describing books as friends, the library as sanctuary, and shelves as sacred without fully developing these powerful images. Exemplar: Having been nurtured by this literary sanctuary throughout my formative years, I count myself amongst the many whose lives have been enriched by its presence. Within these walls, I've formed deep connections with characters who have become lifelong companions—friends who sacrifice for me in ways I could never have imagined outside the pages of their stories.

#3 (Fifth paragraph): Strengths: Your conclusion effectively summarizes the emotional core of your argument. The imagery of the library as more than "glued bricks" creates a memorable ending. Weakness: Specificity and evidence. \rightarrow While emotionally compelling, this paragraph uses general statements without specific examples. Phrases like "flourishing network" and "portal that takes us" need concrete details to make your argument more persuasive and memorable. Exemplar: *Our library stands not as mere bricks and mortar, but as the beating heart of our community. It houses the weekly reading circle where elderly residents find companionship, the homework club where struggling students find guidance, and the children's corner where young minds first*

discover the magic of stories. It is a true portal to countless worlds that has served as the cornerstone of our suburb's cultural identity for generations.

■ Your letter demonstrates passion and emotional investment in your cause, which is commendable. However, your persuasiveness would benefit from more structured arguments and specific examples. While you've included emotional appeals, you could strengthen these by providing concrete examples of how the library benefits different community members. Additionally, your rhetorical questions could be more strategically placed to create maximum impact. Your counterargument paragraph acknowledges opposing views, which is effective, but you could develop this further by addressing specific economic concerns with library-based solutions. Also, consider reorganising your points to build towards your strongest arguments rather than presenting them randomly. The formal letter format needs refinement, particularly in the opening and closing sections. With these adjustments, your passionate defence of the library would become a more compelling case for its preservation.
