Try grouping similar points together - perhaps one paragraph on educational benefits, another on community importance, and a third on demolition concerns. Your vocabulary choices are impressive, but sometimes the words don't quite fit the context. For example, words like "pernicious" and "propitious" are sophisticated but might be used incorrectly. Your letter would benefit from clearer transitions between paragraphs to help guide the reader through your argument. Also, maintaining a consistent formal tone throughout would make your letter more persuasive to council officials. Consider removing conversational elements like "Hey!" and focus on strengthening each paragraph with specific examples of how the library benefits students and community members. Your conclusion could be stronger by clearly restating your main request and suggesting an alternative solution.
