#1 Strengths: ■ Your use of rhetorical questions effectively engages the reader ("Have you ever heard of climate change?") ■ You use vivid imagery to describe climate change as "the shadow to dull the beautiful sun"

Weaknesses: Unclear introduction → Your opening paragraph jumps between ideas without a clear focus. For example, you mention "Humanity's defending moment" but don't explain what this means. Weaknesses: Disorganized paragraph structure → Your second paragraph moves between describing landfills, plastic pollution, and health effects without clear transitions. There's also a dialogue with "John" that appears suddenly without context. This makes it difficult for readers to follow your argument. Try to organize related ideas together and provide smoother transitions between different points.

Exemplar: ***Landfills are a major contributor to climate change. When we throw away rubbish, it doesn't just disappear—it piles up in massive landfill sites where it releases harmful gases into our atmosphere.***

#3 Strengths: ■ Your powerful call to action encourages readers to take responsibility ("We must act immediately to fight back") ■ You effectively create a sense of urgency about climate change in the final paragraph

Weaknesses: Overuse of metaphors → Your final paragraph contains several different metaphors that may confuse readers: "knight against the terrible disasters," "heat is from a matchstick to a fire," and "treacherous heat." Focusing on one clear comparison would make your message stronger and easier to understand.

Exemplar: ***Our future depends on the actions we take today. If we work together to reduce pollution, use renewable energy, and protect natural environments, we can create a safer, healthier planet for future generations.***

However, your writing would benefit from a clearer structure. Try organizing your ideas into distinct paragraphs with a clear topic sentence for each. Also, your article mentions problems but could include more specific solutions that readers can implement in their daily lives. Adding a few practical suggestions like reducing plastic use, saving energy at home, or using public transport would make your article more helpful. Additionally, your conclusion could be stronger by summarizing your main points and ending with an inspiring message that motivates readers to take action. Remember to check your writing for sentence clarity—some of your sentences are quite long and contain multiple ideas that could be separated for better understanding.
