Weaknesses: Inconsistent setting \rightarrow You switch between referring to the body of water as an "ocean," "pond," and later "river" which creates confusion for readers. Pick one consistent term throughout your article.

#2 "Despite the high amounts of plastic that has been dunked in, and the wildlife that has almost been obliterated thanks to the unsuitable habitat wiping most of the food sources fish used to eat, scientists claim that Goldlake is still redeemable and that if we got everyone working to clean Goldlake and help re-establish the population of marine life that once thrived, we can restore the barren wasteland back to its former glory."

Strengths: ■ Your paragraph creates urgency by explaining the serious environmental damage. ■ You offer hope by mentioning that the situation can be reversed with community effort.

Weaknesses: Run-on sentence \rightarrow This extremely long sentence contains too many ideas packed together, making it difficult for readers to follow. Breaking it into smaller sentences would improve clarity.

Exemplar: Despite the high amounts of plastic pollution in Goldlake, scientists claim the river can still be saved. With everyone working together to clean the water and re-establish marine life, we can restore our barren wasteland back to its former glory.

#3 "We need everyone to contribute, and that includes you! We need all the help we can get if we are to embark on such a risky journey, as if we fail, we will waste the resources we spent. It is essential that we involve officials and those in power as well, since they have the materials that we don't have."

Strengths: ■ Your call to action directly engages the reader with the exclamation point and "you!" ■ You identify different groups needed for the clean-up effort (individuals and officials).

Weaknesses: Negative framing \rightarrow Focusing on "wasting resources if we fail" creates unnecessary doubt in readers rather than inspiring action. The paragraph would be stronger if it focused on positive outcomes.

Exemplar: We need everyone to contribute, and that includes you! Your help is vital as we embark on this important journey to restore Goldlake. By involving both community members and officials who have access to necessary resources, we can make a tremendous difference.

■ Your feature article creates a strong emotional appeal about the pollution of Goldlake river. The use of personal stories like Daniel's experience and Officer Christian's family helps readers connect with the issue. However, your article would benefit from a clearer structure with a stronger introduction that immediately identifies Goldlake as a river (not an ocean or pond). Also, try breaking up longer sentences into shorter ones to make your ideas easier to follow.

Additionally, your article would be more effective if you included specific actions readers can take to help. Instead of just asking them to "assist us," provide 2-3 concrete steps they could follow, such as joining clean-up days or reducing their plastic use.

The statistics about property values add important context, but you could connect these facts more clearly to your main message about saving the river. Your conclusion effectively reminds readers why Goldlake matters emotionally, but adding a final specific call to action would make your ending more powerful.

Finally, your writing uses emotional language effectively, but ensure that emotions are balanced with practical information about how the river can actually be restored. This would make your piece more convincing and actionable for your readers.
