#1: Letter to Local Council Member

Strengths:

- You've effectively used factual information (the 2022 report) to support your argument.
- Your closing is strong and respectful, maintaining the formal tone throughout.

Weakness: Limited policy suggestions → Your letter mentions creating "rules to reduce plastic waste" but gives only two brief examples. This makes your request seem less thought-out. For example, you write "like banning plastic bags and helping clean-up programs" but don't explain how these would work. I ask the council to create comprehensive rules to reduce plastic waste, including banning single-use plastic bags, implementing a container deposit scheme, and supporting community clean-up programs with council resources.

#2: Speech for School Assembly

Strengths:

- Your opening question about the turtle creates an immediate emotional connection.
- You've used short, impactful sentences that work well for a spoken presentation.

Weakness: Missing specific examples → While you mention bringing reusable water bottles and saying no to straws, you could strengthen your speech by including more concrete examples of how plastic affects marine life. Your line "Animals eat it. Some die." could be more impactful with specific details. *Marine animals mistake plastic bags for jellyfish and eat them. A turtle with a belly full of plastic can't eat real food. It slowly starves. This happens to thousands of sea creatures every day.*

#3: Article for General Public

Strengths:

- Your title clearly states both the problem and that solutions exist.
- You've created a positive tone by emphasizing that "we can fix it."

Weakness: Underdeveloped solutions section → Your article briefly mentions solutions but doesn't explain why they work or how to implement them. For instance, "Recycle properly"

doesn't tell readers what proper recycling involves. Recycle properly by checking which plastics your local council accepts, rinsing containers before recycling, and separating different materials. Even better, choose products with less packaging or packaging made from sustainable materials like paper or cardboard.

■ Your writing shows a good understanding of different formats and audiences. You've adjusted your tone appropriately for each piece – formal for the council letter, friendly for the speech, and informative for the article. However, your writing could benefit from more specific details and examples. For instance, when you mention "plastic pollution," you could describe exactly what this looks like on beaches or how it affects specific marine animals. Also, your solutions tend to be quite general. Try adding clear, practical steps that your readers can follow. You could also strengthen your writing by including more emotive language in your speech and article to connect with your audience on an emotional level. Additionally, consider adding a stronger sense of urgency, especially in your letter to the council, to emphasize why action is needed now rather than later.
