The sentence "Who wants bugs in their canteen nibbling your leftovers..." is too long and combines several ideas that would be more effective if separated and developed individually.

Exemplar: Food crumbs left behind can attract bugs and other pests, creating health hazards for everyone using the canteen. By cleaning up properly after ourselves, we prevent these problems.

#3 Strengths: You effectively connect environmental sustainability with everyday canteen practices. Your focus on practical actions shows thoughtful consideration of the issue.

Weakness: Sentence structure → There's an awkward phrasing in "Treating the canteen as a shared space not just a place to eat---encourages us to make mindful choices." The use of dashes is inconsistent with the rest of your writing, and the sentence structure makes your point less clear than it could be.

Exemplar: When we treat the canteen as a shared community space rather than just a place to eat, we become more mindful about our choices and their impact.

You might also want to include more specific examples of the small actions students can take. For instance, what exactly should students do with leftover food? How can they best clean up spills? Adding these practical details would make your message even more helpful. Your enthusiasm for the topic comes through nicely - keep that energy while making your points more focused!
