Strengths:

Weakness: Incomplete sentence structure \rightarrow Your sentence "the environmental crisis on our way to" is incomplete and disrupts the flow of your argument. This makes your point less clear and impacts the persuasiveness of your introduction. You've started a strong idea but haven't finished expressing it fully.

Exemplar: "In a world where plastic litter is flowing freely in our oceans and seas, people continue to use plastic despite knowing the environmental crisis we are facing."

Strengths:

- Includes specific statistics that create a powerful image of the scale of plastic pollution
- Breaks down the numbers in multiple ways to emphasise the magnitude of the problem

Weakness: Punctuation error \rightarrow You've used a comma after "Did you know" but then continued with a statement rather than a question. This creates confusion about whether you're asking a question or making a statement. The sentence also ends with a full stop when it should have a question mark since it begins as a question.

Exemplar: "Did you know that there's an estimated 5.25 trillion pieces of plastic in the ocean, including both macro and microplastics, with 46,000 pieces in every square mile?"

Strengths:

Weakness: Unclear comparison \rightarrow The phrase "floating like the stick on the ocean that we see today" doesn't create a clear comparison. It's not obvious what "the stick" refers to, making this image less effective than it could be. This unclear reference weakens your otherwise strong visual description.

Exemplar: "Their oceans, that we now see as pristine and clear, will be a humongous mountain of plastic debris, floating like the plastic bottles and bags we already see washing up on our beaches today."

■ Your piece makes a passionate case against plastic use in school canteens, but could be strengthened with more specific solutions. You mention that non-plastic alternatives can be cheaper, but don't provide concrete examples of what the school could actually use instead. Also, your writing would be more persuasive if you included information about what other schools have done successfully. Your opening paragraph effectively identifies the problem, but you could improve the structure by clearly separating your arguments into different paragraphs with clear topic sentences. The emotional appeal in your second paragraph is powerful, but adding one or two practical steps the school association could take would make your argument more actionable. You could also strengthen your case by explaining how students themselves might help with this transition. Remember to check your sentences carefully to make sure they're complete and clear.
