#1 Strengths: Your strong emotional appeal and use of rhetorical questions at the beginning grab the reader's attention. Your passion about the topic comes through clearly.

#2 Strengths: Your vivid imagery creates a powerful mental picture for readers. Asking readers to close their eyes and imagine a dystopian future is an effective persuasive technique.

Weaknesses: Unclear progression of ideas \rightarrow Your third paragraph jumps directly to an extreme future scenario without providing the logical steps of how we might get there. Phrases like "toxic clouds that sweep over the ground like phantoms riseing from the dead" are dramatic but don't explain the specific climate impacts that would cause this situation. There are also several spelling errors that distract from your message.

Exemplar: Close your eyes for a moment. Imagine the last few million people on Earth huddled together in protective domes, looking out at a barren landscape. Outside, powerful hurricanes and rising sea levels have destroyed our homes, while toxic air makes it impossible to breathe without protection. This future isn't science fiction—it's the path we're currently on if we don't address climate change.

#3 Strengths: Your conclusion offers a hopeful message and a call to action, which is essential in a persuasive speech. You encourage cooperation and provide a sense that change is possible.

Weaknesses: Vague solutions \rightarrow Your conclusion states that "we must stop the dark future" and "work on repairs," but doesn't offer specific actions readers can take. Phrases like "preserve the earth for millinias to come" sound inspiring but don't guide readers on what steps to take immediately. The conclusion feels rushed compared to the detailed problems you presented earlier.

Exemplar: In conclusion, we must treat our Earth like the precious resource it is. Each of us can make a difference through simple daily actions: reducing plastic use, choosing

public transport, supporting renewable energy, and demanding climate action from our leaders. Together, we can slow or even stop this ticking time bomb. By working together, we can preserve our planet for thousands of generations to come.

■ Your speech shows great passion for climate change, but needs clearer organisation to be truly persuasive. The emotional language you use is powerful, but sometimes overshadows your main points. Try dividing your speech into three clear sections: the problem, the consequences, and the solutions. Your second paragraph mentions wildfires as an example, which is good, but you could strengthen this by adding one or two more specific climate effects. Your final paragraph offers hope but misses the opportunity to give your audience specific actions they can take. Also, try reading your speech aloud to catch spelling mistakes and awkward sentences. Your use of imagery is very strong, especially when asking readers to imagine the future. With some polishing, your important message will come through more clearly and inspire others to take action.
