Exemplar: The broken equipment means only half our class can use the playground at once, leaving many students standing around with nothing to do during our short lunch breaks.

#3 Strengths: You've outlined clear, actionable steps that readers can take to support the campaign. The list format makes it easy to understand how everyone can contribute.

Weaknesses: Overuse of exclamation marks \rightarrow Almost every sentence in this section ends with an exclamation mark, which weakens their impact. The enthusiasm appears forced rather than genuine. Phrases like "unstoppable" and "force to be reckoned with" might seem overdramatic without concrete examples of how student action has worked before.

Exemplar: Our school responded positively last year when Year 4 students suggested new library books, showing that when we work together respectfully, the teachers listen.

■ Your persuasive email shows enthusiasm and passion for improving the playground, which is great! However, your argument would be more convincing with specific examples of problems and their solutions. Try mentioning exactly which equipment is broken and how it affects playtime. Also, include practical benefits of a new playground, such as fewer injuries or more students being able to play at once. Your call to action is clear, but you could strengthen it by

suggesting a specific meeting date to discuss ideas or a deadline for the petition. Additionally, consider mentioning how the improvements would benefit teachers and the school's reputation, not just students. Remember to vary your punctuation instead of using exclamation marks throughout. Your email has potential—with more specific details and a balanced approach, you'll likely persuade more students to join your campaign.
