■ Your persuasive email shows passion for playground safety, which is a strength. However, your message would be more effective with a calmer, more balanced approach. Try focusing on specific safety concerns rather than using dramatic language that might seem exaggerated. Your comparison between physical and academic growth is thoughtful, but gets lost among emotional appeals. Also, consider your audience - Principal Brown will respond better to respectful requests than to accusations or ultimatums. You could improve by offering specific, practical suggestions for playground improvements. Additionally, you might want to organise your email more clearly with an introduction stating your main concern, body paragraphs with evidence, and a conclusion with a clear request. Your email would be stronger if you used a

collaborative tone that assumes the principal shares your concern for student safety rather than suggesting they don't care.
