Exemplar: Our four-step plan includes: first, removing the uneven concrete and replacing it with a level surface; second, removing all dangerous metal pieces and rust; third, hiring professional pest controllers to eliminate the insect infestation; and finally, replacing all broken equipment with safe, modern alternatives.

■ Your persuasive piece has a clear purpose and includes some good elements, but needs more development to be truly convincing. Your introduction captures attention, but could be stronger with a clearer statement of your main argument. Your plan for fixing the playground is a good start, but needs more detail about how these improvements will benefit students beyond

just making the playground safe. Additionally, your conclusion repeats many of the same points without adding new insights. You could improve by adding more specific examples of how a renovated playground would positively impact student wellbeing and learning. Consider organising your paragraphs more clearly around main points, and use topic sentences to guide the reader. Also, try to vary your sentence structure to make your writing more engaging. Remember to carefully proofread your work to fix spelling and grammar errors, as these mistakes can distract from your message.
