DAY 6 | HOLIDAY WRITING HOMEWORK

Section 1:

#1: Email 1, Paragraph 1 Strengths:

- You've created a vivid picture of the dilapidated playground through descriptive language.
- Your use of sensory details helps the reader visualize the poor conditions.

Weakness: Sentence structure \rightarrow This opening paragraph consists of one extremely long run-on sentence that affects readability and impact. The paragraph would be more effective if broken into multiple sentences with proper punctuation. The formal tone expected in a council letter is also missing.

Exemplar: Dear Councillor, I am writing to bring your urgent attention to the concerning state of our school playground. The monkey bars are rotting away, while the once-bright yellow slide has faded dramatically, appearing decades older than its actual age. The floorboards creak dangerously underfoot, and the concrete is cracked throughout the play area.

#2: Email 2, Paragraph 1 Strengths:

- Good use of emotive language to create urgency about the playground condition.
- Effective detailed descriptions of specific hazards that create concern.

Weakness: Audience adaptation \rightarrow While the email addresses the business owner directly, it jumps straight into the request without establishing a relationship or connection with the recipient. There's no introduction explaining who you are or why the business owner should be interested in helping.

Exemplar: Hello Maverick, My name is Pukhraj, and I'm reaching out regarding our local school playground that desperately needs renovation. As a respected business owner in our community, your support could make a tremendous difference to the children who currently face hazardous conditions daily: loose platforms that wobble beneath their feet, rusting metal equipment with dangerous sharp edges, and neglected areas where plants once grew.

#3: Email 1, Paragraph 3 Strengths:

- Your inclusion of a specific example about Anthony Carlos adds credibility and emotional impact.
- The connection between the injury and his ruined dreams creates emotional resonance.

Weakness: Figurative language \rightarrow Despite the prompt requiring figurative language, this powerful example lacks metaphor, simile or personification that could enhance its emotional impact. The statement about dreams being "savagely destroyed" is emotive but not truly figurative.

Exemplar: Just a few months ago, 8-year-old Anthony Carlos was enjoying the swings when the faulty equipment suddenly gave way like a trapdoor beneath him. As he fell to the ground, he heard his arm crack—a sound that echoed the shattering of his tennis career dreams. The X-ray confirmed a fractured elbow, and with it, his aspirations withered like unwatered seedlings.

Your emails show good potential in creating emotional appeals about the playground renovation. The descriptions of the deteriorating conditions effectively convey the urgent need for intervention. You've successfully painted a picture of the current state and what could be achieved through renovation.

Additionally, your attempt to engage the senses works well in several sections, particularly when describing visual elements like rotting monkey bars and faded markings. Both emails contain clear requests, which is essential for persuasive writing.

Also, I notice your contrast between the current state and potential future state creates a compelling narrative in both emails. However, your writing would benefit from better structure and organization. Breaking up long sentences, using proper email formatting with appropriate salutations (especially for the council member), and creating clearer paragraph divisions would strengthen your message considerably.

Your persuasive technique could be enhanced by focusing more on the benefits to each specific audience—highlighting community reputation and safety compliance for the council member, and potential publicity and community goodwill for the business owner. Remember that persuasive writing should always address "what's in it for them."
