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## Section 1:

### Part #1

Without evidence from authoritative sources, these claims appear speculative rather than factual, which weakens your argument about pollution's actual impacts.

**Exemplar:** *"Envisage a world where the beautiful sounds of birds chirping are silenced by warning sirens. According to Dr. Jane Smith, environmental scientist at Oxford University, 'We're already seeing concerning shifts in air quality in major cities, with a 25% reduction in urban bird populations over the last decade.'"*

### Strengths:

- You've attempted to include a personal perspective in your article.
- You're trying to appeal to emotions through a child's perspective.

**Weakness:** Source credibility → Your article relies on a 10-year-old child as a primary source rather than authoritative experts in environmental science. The quote doesn't provide specific observations about environmental changes, just general disappointment. A feature article requires more credible sources like scientists, researchers, or community leaders with expertise.

**Exemplar:** *"In just the past decade, we've documented a 15% increase in respiratory conditions among children in our community," explains Dr. Ahmed Hassan, Head of Paediatric Medicine at City Hospital. "These conditions correlate directly with declining air quality measurements."*

■ Your piece shows enthusiasm for an important environmental topic, but needs significant development to meet the requirements of a feature article. The current draft lacks the required length (750-1000 words) and is missing several key elements including expert voices, specific statistics, and advanced transitions. Your writing would benefit from a clearer structure with well-defined paragraphs that build your argument logically. Additionally, your piece needs more concrete examples of how air pollution affects your specific school or community rather than general statements. You could strengthen your

article by interviewing local environmental experts, gathering specific data about air quality in your area, and researching successful pollution reduction initiatives. Also, consider expanding your conclusion to provide readers with specific actions they can take to address the issue in your community.
