## Section 1:

- #1: First paragraph Strengths: Your introduction clearly states your topic about Japan being your favourite place. You also create anticipation by mentioning you'll explain your reasons in subsequent paragraphs. Weakness: Repetition → You mention "never been to Japan" three times in this short paragraph, which creates redundancy. You also don't incorporate any figurative language or imagery as required by the prompt. Exemplar: Japan calls to me like a siren song across the ocean, a mysterious land I've yet to explore but one that captures my imagination completely.
- #2: Second paragraph Strengths: You provide specific examples of Japanese food items, showing your knowledge about Japanese cuisine. Your enthusiasm for Japanese food comes through clearly. Weakness: Limited descriptive language → Your paragraph lists food items without using sensory details or figurative language to help readers imagine these foods. Exemplar: *The delicate art of sushi-making entrances me, with its vibrant colours arranged like jewels on pristine plates, and the steaming bowls of ramen that warm both body and soul with their rich, aromatic broths.*
- #3: Fourth paragraph Strengths: You include several interesting facts about Japan, demonstrating research and knowledge about the country. Your excitement about these facts is evident. Weakness: Lack of cohesion → The facts are presented as a list rather than being woven together into a cohesive narrative with transitions between ideas. Exemplar: From the mystical Rabbit Island where fluffy creatures hop freely amongst visitors, to the ancient company that has weathered the storms of centuries, Japan's fascinating contradictions create a tapestry of old and new unlike anywhere else on Earth.
- Your piece shows genuine enthusiasm for Japan, which is a great foundation. However, it would benefit greatly from incorporating more sensory details and figurative language as required by the prompt. Currently, your writing presents facts and lists rather than creating vivid imagery that transports the reader to Japan. Also, try to organise your ideas more cohesively within paragraphs and use more varied sentence structures to maintain reader interest. Additionally, consider focusing on describing the sensory experiences one might have in Japan—the sights, sounds, smells, tastes, and textures—rather than just stating facts. When discussing Nintendo, try to evoke the magic and excitement through

more descriptive language rather than listing activities. Your passion for Japan shines through, but more attention to creating a vivid sensory experience would strengthen your writing significantly.
