## Section 1:

#1: Introduction Strengths: Your introduction clearly states your name and position you're running for. You preview your main arguments effectively. Exemplar: "I've demonstrated kindness by mentoring three classmates through difficult maths projects, standing up to bullies in the playground when they targeted younger students, and organising birthday cards for everyone to ensure no one feels forgotten."

- #3: Second argument (Responsibility) Strengths: You clearly identify responsibility as a key leadership quality. Your point is direct and straightforward. Weakness: Underdeveloped reasoning  $\rightarrow$  This section is very brief and doesn't fully explain how your responsibility specifically qualifies you for the role of class president. The connection between "not forgetting anything" and presidential duties isn't clearly established. Exemplar: "My responsibility shines through my perfect attendance record, consistent completion of all assignments before deadlines, and my current role as library monitor where I've never once missed my shift. As president, I would bring this same reliability to representing your concerns to teachers and organising class events."
- Your speech has a solid foundation with three clear qualities that make you a good candidate. However, the arguments lack depth and persuasive power. To strengthen your speech, you need to develop each quality with more specific examples and connect them directly to how they would benefit your classmates if you were president. Additionally, your speech would be more compelling if you included direct appeals to your audience's

needs and concerns. Also, consider adding rhetorical questions or a memorable slogan to make your speech more engaging. The conclusion is abrupt; expand it to remind your classmates of your key points and make a final emotional appeal. Remember that a persuasive speech should not just tell why you're qualified but show how your leadership would positively impact the class.
