Section 1:

#1 First Paragraph: Strengths: Your vivid imagery effectively contrasts an idyllic natural world with the harsh reality of plastic pollution. Your emotional appeal regarding endangered marine life creates a strong connection with your audience. Weakness: Inconsistent tone  $\rightarrow$  The shift between the imaginative opening and the stark facts about plastic pollution feels abrupt. The passionate tone occasionally veers into melodrama with phrases like "murdered just by swallowing" which might alienate some listeners. Exemplar: *Imagine a world where animal populations soar and plants flourish; where dozens of bird species fly freely through clean air. Now contrast this with our reality: marine creatures mistaking plastic bags for jellyfish, consuming microplastics that harm both them and eventually us. We face an urgent choice.* 

#2 Statistics Paragraph: Strengths: Your use of specific percentages lends authority to your argument. The transition from global problems to local solutions is effective. Weakness: Vague data sources  $\rightarrow$  The statistics presented lack attribution or context. Phrases like "47% of plastic" and "58% of these kill animals" need clearer sources and explanations to be truly persuasive. Exemplar: According to recent environmental studies, approximately 47% of discarded plastic ends up in our oceans annually. Marine biologists have documented that nearly 60% of this waste directly harms sea creatures within twelve months. Our school park clean-up represents a small yet vital step toward addressing this global crisis.

#3 Call to Action Closing: Strengths: Your repetition of "Join me" creates a powerful rhythmic pattern. The direct address to different audience members (parents, teachers, students) personalises the appeal. Weakness: Limited practical guidance  $\rightarrow$  While emotionally compelling, your closing lacks specific instructions about how to participate in the park clean-up. Phrases like "help me, help animals" would benefit from concrete action steps. Exemplar: Join me in our park clean-up tomorrow at 10am. Bring gloves if you have them. Join me in taking tangible steps toward environmental stewardship. Whether you're a parent, teacher or student, I urge you to reconsider daily choices that impact our planet. Together, we can begin to reverse the damage—one piece of litter at a time.

■ Your speech demonstrates passion and commitment to environmental conservation, particularly regarding plastic pollution. You've created some compelling visual imagery and a strong call to action. To strengthen your piece further, consider balancing emotional appeals with more substantive evidence. Additionally, your speech would benefit from clearer organisation with smoother transitions between ideas. The statistical evidence needs proper citation and explanation to be more convincing. Also, provide specific details about the clean-up event (time, location, what to bring) to make your call to action more effective. Your conclusion could be more impactful if you added a memorable final statement that resonates with your audience after they leave. Your writing shows promise - with these adjustments, you could create an even more persuasive environmental speech.

## Section 2:
