Section 1:

#1 (Formal Email, 2nd paragraph) Strengths:

- Strong use of persuasive evidence by highlighting safety concerns with specific examples like "slips or falls" and "cuts, scrapes".
- Good use of emotive and descriptive language to create urgency around the playground issues.

Weakness: Lack of specificity about the current playground condition. → Your paragraph mentions general hazards but doesn't provide concrete details about the actual state of your school's playground, making your argument less compelling. For instance, you write about "litter and debris" but don't specify what particular problems exist in your playground currently.

Exemplar: To begin with, a clean playground ensures everyone's safety. Our current playground, with its broken swing chains, splintered wooden benches, and scattered glass fragments near the football pitch, poses significant hazards that have already led to three minor injuries this term alone.

#2 (Formal Email, 4th paragraph) Strengths:

- Excellent connection between playground cleanliness and students' mental wellbeing.
- Sophisticated vocabulary and formal register appropriate for addressing the principal.

Weakness: Excessive generalization. → You present general claims about the benefits of clean environments on mental health without connecting them specifically to your school context or providing evidence. When you write "clean, organized spaces are known to promote feelings of calm and happiness," you could strengthen this with school-specific observations or research.

Exemplar: A clean playground significantly impacts students' wellbeing. Since our Year 3 students began experiencing increasing anxiety during outdoor activities, our

school counsellor has noted that cluttered environments contribute to heightened stress levels. Studies from the British School Health Association demonstrate that orderly recreational spaces improve concentration by 27% and reduce playground conflicts by nearly a third.

#3 (Informal Email, 3rd paragraph) Strengths:

- Effectively uses an informal, conversational tone appropriate for fellow students.
- Good establishment of emotional connection with phrases like "it's kind of sad".

Weakness: Limited persuasiveness. → Your paragraph expresses disappointment but doesn't effectively motivate students to action. You mention that "if it was cleaner, more people would enjoy it" without providing compelling reasons for why they should personally care or get involved.

Exemplar: It's actually super disappointing because our playground could be amazing! Remember how awesome it was when we first started school? Kids from other years used to beg to use our space! If we all pitch in to clean it up, we could bring back those epic football matches and actually have somewhere decent to chill during breaks instead of being squashed in the corridors when it rains.

Your writing demonstrates a good understanding of the differences between formal and informal registers. The formal email maintains an appropriate tone throughout and includes necessary email components. Your informal email effectively uses contractions, colloquial phrases, and a conversational style that works well for communicating with peers.

The structure of both emails is generally logical, with clear introductions, supporting paragraphs, and conclusions. However, your writing would benefit from more specific details about the current playground condition, concrete examples of how improvements would benefit the school community, and stronger calls to action.

■ The depth of content in your formal email shows more development than your informal email. While both pieces include emotive and descriptive language, you could enhance the persuasive impact by incorporating more concrete details about the current playground state and specific improvements needed. Additionally, your formal email would benefit from including practical details such as potential funding sources or a timeline for improvements, making your proposal more actionable for the principal. Your informal email needs a stronger call to action to motivate fellow students to support your

campaign. Try to create a sense of urgency and excitement that will encourage immediate participation.
