Strengths:

Weakness: Missing statistical evidence → While you claim the library has a "humungous" role in the educational system, you don't substantiate this with any concrete data. Phrases like "helped build the community" and "without it we all wouldn't be here" need supporting statistics about literacy rates, educational outcomes, or community usage patterns.

Exemplar: *"According to recent town surveys, over 70% of local students use our library weekly for research, and it hosts 25 different educational programmes annually, serving more than 5,000 residents."*

Strengths:

- You nicely emphasise the inspirational role the library plays for younger generations.
- You attempt to address the mall as an alternative but inferior option.

Weakness: Underdeveloped counterargument → Your brief mention that "People want to go to a mall if they don't want to learn to study" begins to address counter-arguments but doesn't fully engage with economic reasons why others might prefer a mall. The statement "It is stupid that the council thinks" dismisses opposing views without substantial engagement.

Exemplar: *"While proponents argue that a new mall would bring 200 jobs and increased tax revenue to our town, these economic benefits are short-term compared to the library's proven long-term impact on educational outcomes and community cohesion, as documented in Professor Johnson's 2023 study on community libraries."*

■ Your piece shows genuine passion for saving the library, which is its greatest strength. However, your persuasive argument would benefit significantly from adding specific evidence. Try including actual library usage statistics, historical dates, or expert opinions from educators or historians. Also, your counterargument section needs more development – acknowledging and then refuting the economic benefits of a mall would make your argument more balanced and convincing. Additionally, your organisation could be improved by adding clear topic sentences at the beginning of each paragraph to guide your reader. Pay careful attention to spelling and grammar, as these errors distract from your important message. Finally, consider adding a clear call to action at the end, telling readers exactly what steps they can take to help save the library.
