Section 1:

#1 (First paragraph - "As I walk into the bush...")

Strengths: You begin with a vivid visual image that immediately draws the reader in. Your global perspective shows awareness that climate change affects diverse ecosystems worldwide.

Weakness: Abrupt transitions \rightarrow Your paragraph jumps quickly between different ideas without smooth connections. For example, you move from "I immediately see nothing but dirt, cut down tree, and fire" to suddenly mentioning rainforests in South America without a linking sentence. This creates a disjointed reading experience and dilutes the impact of your personal connection.

Exemplar: As I walk into the bush, I'm confronted by a disturbing sight: nothing but dirt, tree stumps, and ash from recent fires. This devastation isn't isolated—similar environmental destruction is happening everywhere, from the lush rainforests of South America to the savannas of Africa.

#2 (Second paragraph - "It is getting worse and harder to control...")

Strengths: You effectively communicate urgency and show personal commitment to change. The acknowledgement that you "can't save the environment immediately" demonstrates realistic thinking.

Weakness: Vague statements \rightarrow While you mention the problem is "getting worse" and "bigger by the minute," you don't provide specific examples or evidence. The sentence "the future that is predicted is coming sooner than we think" lacks concrete details about what this future entails. Without specifics, your argument lacks persuasive power.

Exemplar: The crisis worsens daily as our global population grows, consuming resources at an unsustainable rate. Recent scientific reports predict that if current trends continue, we could see a 3°C temperature rise by 2050—decades earlier than previously forecast. While I cannot solve this enormous challenge single-handedly, I believe our collective actions can create meaningful change.

#3 (Fourth paragraph - "The problem is that not many people listen...")

Strengths: You acknowledge opposing viewpoints by mentioning those motivated by money rather than environmental concerns. Your closing line offers a positive, forward-looking sentiment.

Weakness: Underdeveloped counter-argument \rightarrow Your treatment of the opposing view is brief and doesn't fully engage with their perspective. The statement "they just want money" oversimplifies complex motivations and doesn't address legitimate economic concerns that might prevent environmental action. This makes your argument less persuasive to those who hold differing views.

Exemplar: While some dismiss environmental concerns in favour of economic growth, this perspective creates a false choice between prosperity and sustainability. Many businesses have demonstrated that eco-friendly practices can actually increase profits through reduced energy costs, consumer loyalty, and innovative products. We need not sacrifice financial security to protect our planet—we can and must pursue both.

■ Your speech shows passion for environmental protection and includes some descriptive language. However, your piece would benefit from more specific examples and data to support your claims. Try adding one compelling statistic about climate change to each paragraph. Additionally, your personal connection could be strengthened by sharing a more detailed anecdote about your own experience with environmental degradation. Also, work on developing smoother transitions between ideas—consider using linking phrases like "Furthermore" or "Despite these challenges" to connect your thoughts. Your call to action needs more specificity—instead of general suggestions, provide one concrete action your audience can take immediately after hearing your speech. Your conclusion would be more memorable with a powerful image or metaphor that ties back to your opening.
