Additionally, you could strengthen your conclusion by comparing Narnia to existing societies that have successfully reduced crime without such extreme measures. Also, consider adding more sensory details about what life in Narnia actually feels like for everyday citizens—do they feel constantly watched or genuinely free? The contrast between the severe punishments and the "happy" citizens could be explored more deeply.
