#### Section 1:

Strengths: Your use of specific examples and statistics adds credibility to your argument. The vivid descriptions of animal suffering effectively appeal to the reader's emotions.

Weakness: Argumentative progression  $\rightarrow$  The impact statements feel somewhat disconnected from one another. The paragraph jumps from statistics to examples without clear linkage. *Consider how these 8 million tons translate to approximately one rubbish truck of plastic dumped into our oceans every minute, creating an underwater nightmare where once-pristine habitats become plastic graveyards.*

Strengths: Your conclusion effectively uses water metaphors that tie beautifully to your ocean theme. The call to action is inspirational without being preachy.

Weakness: Concrete direction  $\rightarrow$  While poetic, your conclusion lacks specific next steps for the reader. The phrase "becoming stewards" is vague. Also, your examples could benefit from more personalisation to help readers connect their individual actions directly to ocean outcomes. Try incorporating more sensory details that transport readers to both the beauty of healthy oceans and the devastation of plastic pollution. Additionally, your solutions section could be expanded with more innovative approaches beyond the common suggestions. Remember that concrete examples and specific calls to action often leave the strongest impression on readers.
