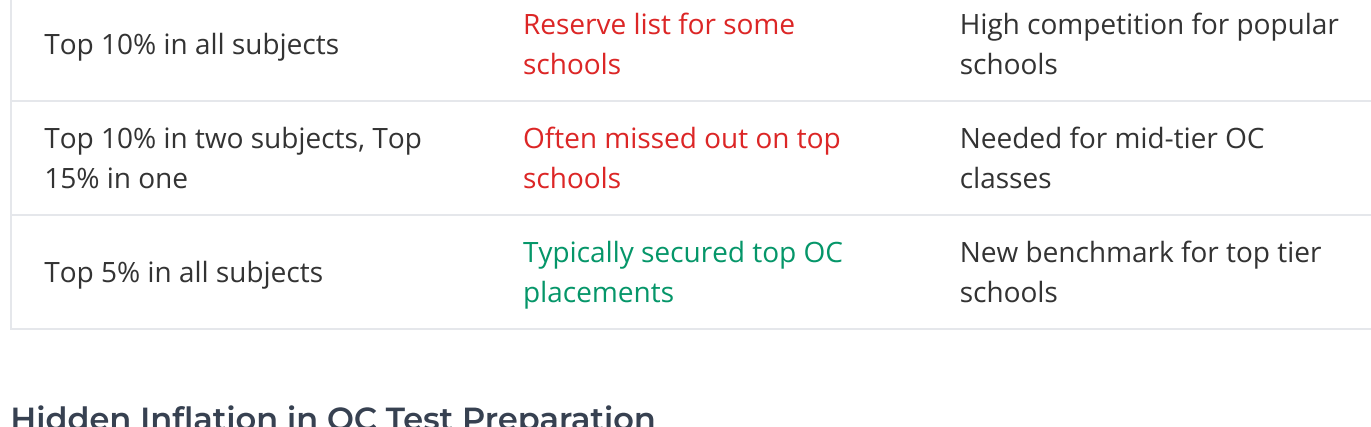

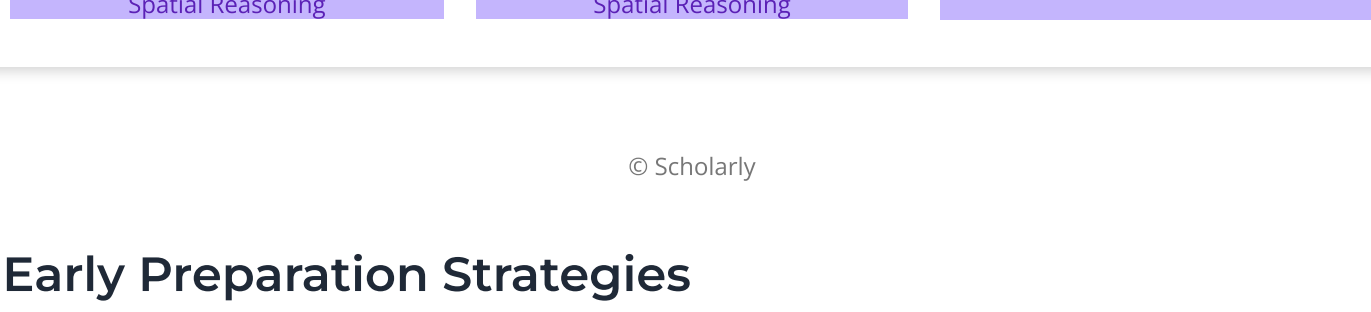

The standards have risen dramatically due to:

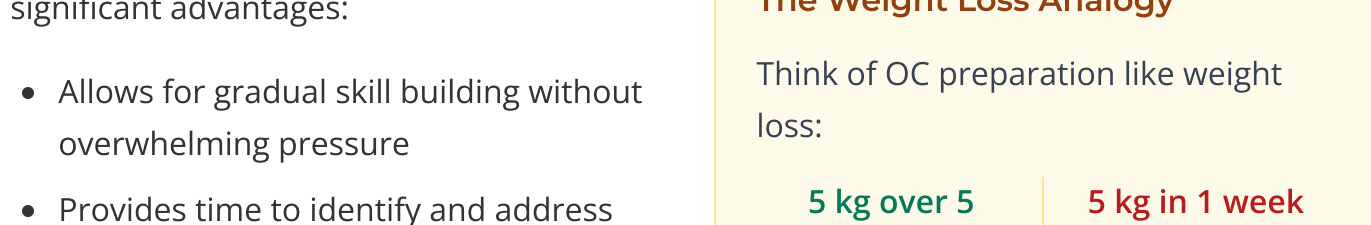
- More students receiving specialized coaching

Why Start in Year 3?

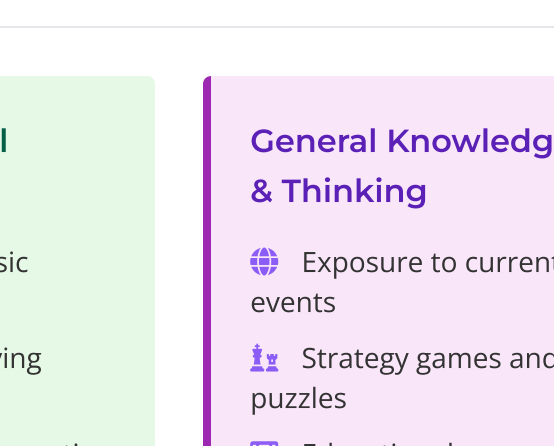
Starting OC preparation in Year 3 provides significant advantages:

School Tier	Performance Typically Required	Preparation Level Needed
Top 3 OC Schools (e.g., Berowra, Matthew Pearce, North Rocks)	Top 1-3% across all subjects	Very intensive, 3-4 years of prior development
Top 10 OC Schools (e.g., Artarmon, Ironbark Ridge)	Top 5% across all subjects	Intensive, 2-3 years recommended
Top 11-20 OC Schools	Top 10% in two subjects, top 15% in one	Moderate to intensive, 1-2 years
Other OC Schools	Top 15-20% average	Moderate, 1+ year

Advantages of Widening School Choices

- Higher chance of placement success
- Less pressure on child and family
- More geographic options
- Any OC class provides academic benefits

Common Pitfalls to Avoid

- Applying only to the most popular schools

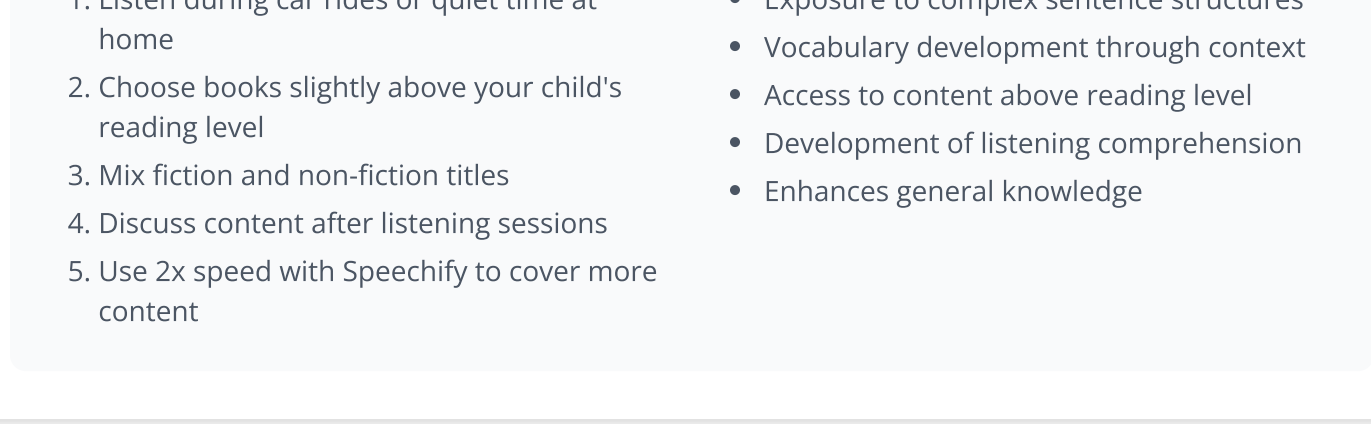

- Use 2x speed with Speechify to cover more content

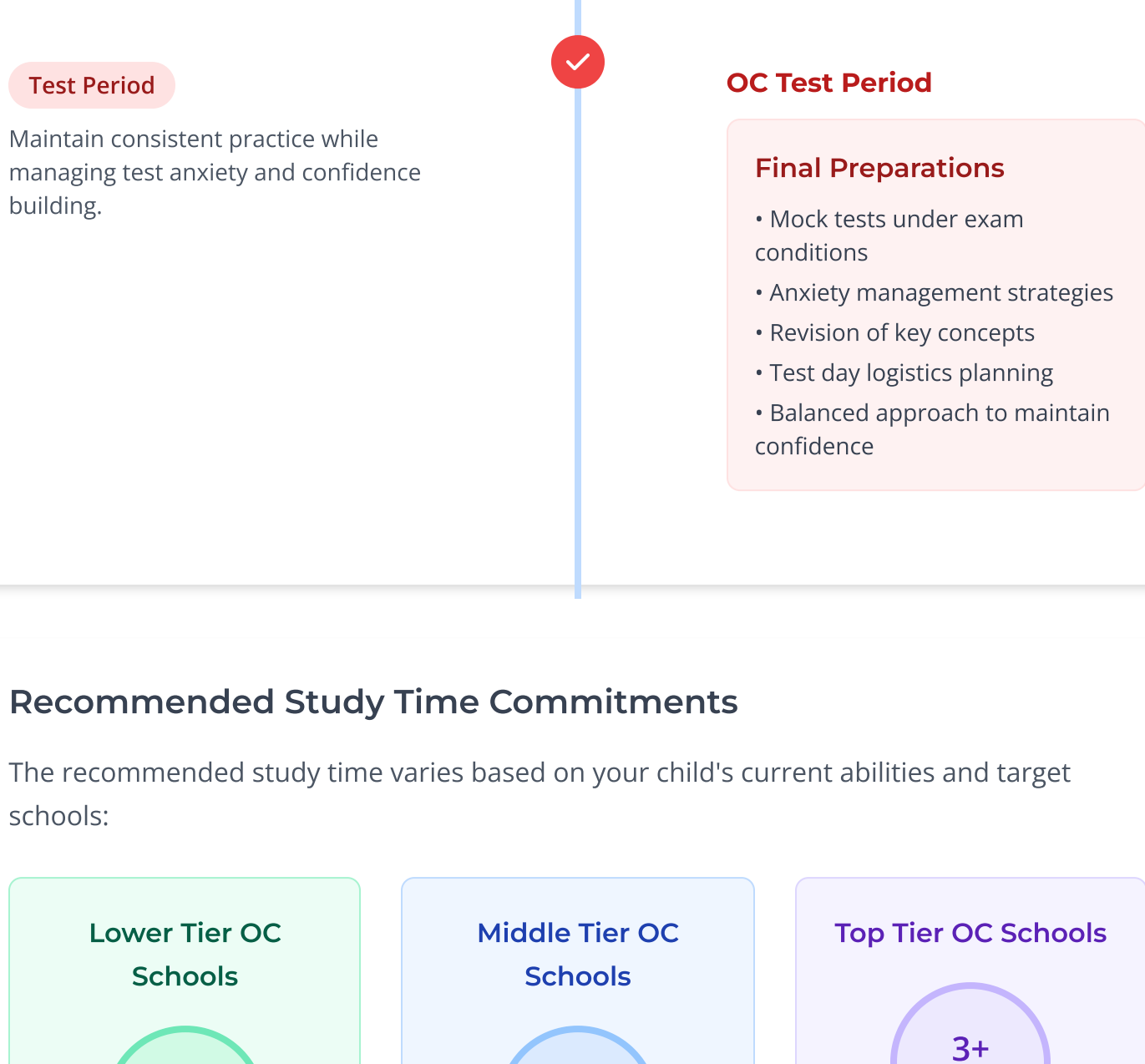
Benefits

- Enhances general knowledge

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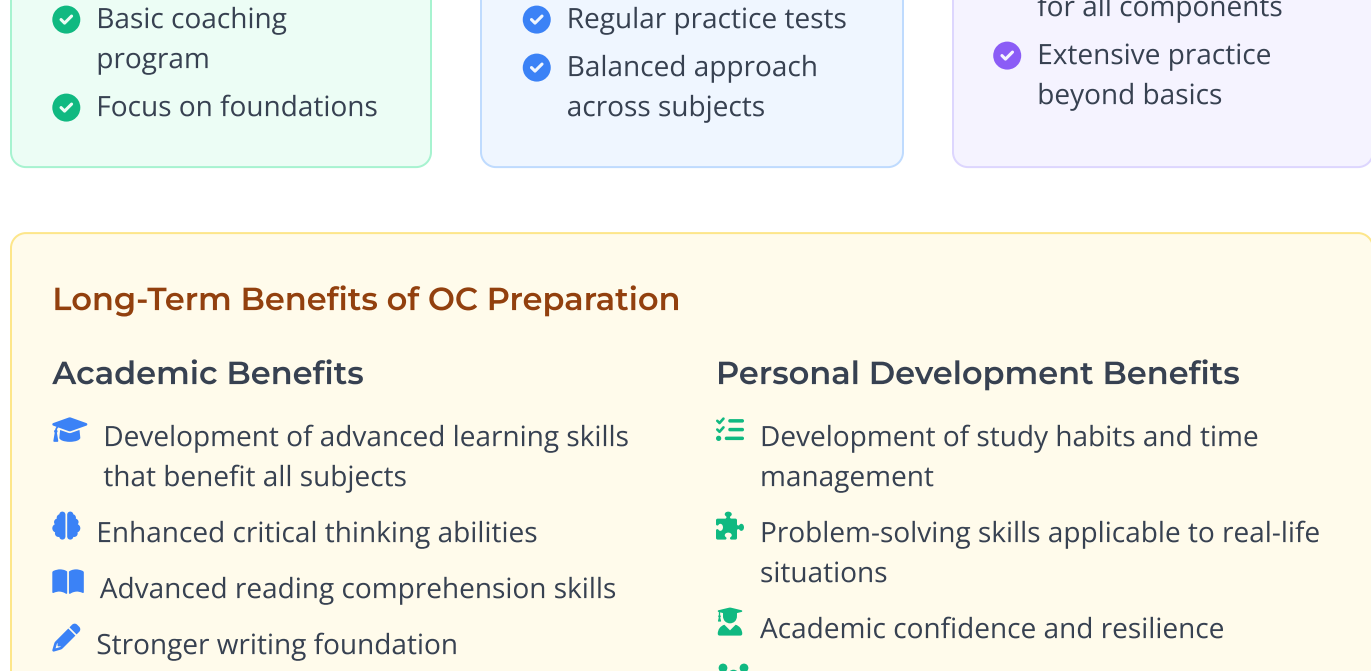
Comprehensive Preparation Timeline

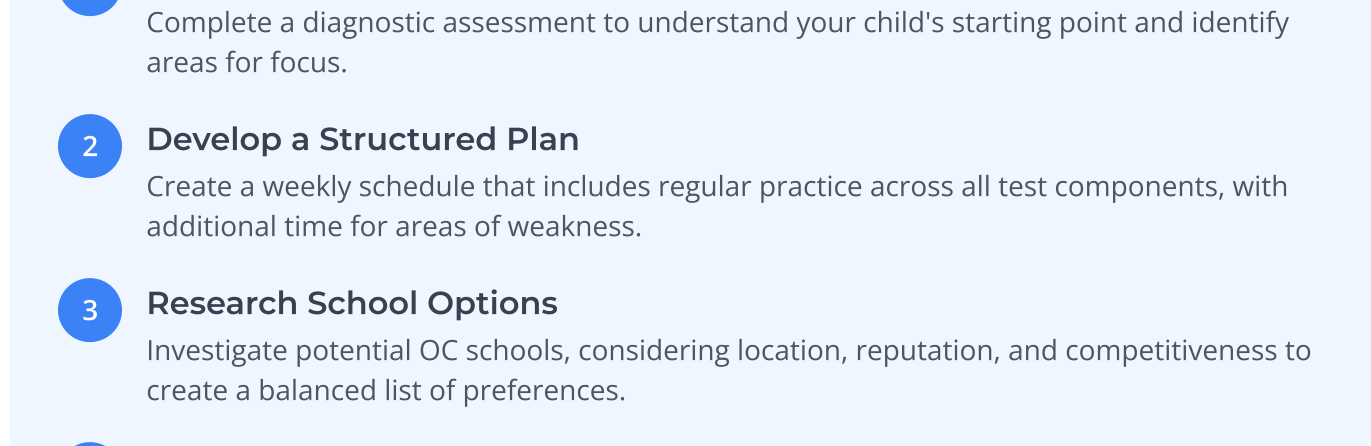
Focus on Fundamentals First
