Section 1:

#1: Opening paragraph

Strengths: Your introduction effectively establishes the setting of Manford and creates suspense with the approaching storm. The contrast between the experienced and inexperienced townspeople shows good character development.

Weakness: Incomplete world-building \rightarrow Your opening paragraph introduces the town and storm but lacks sufficient details about the protagonist Raymond, who appears suddenly in a later paragraph. The statement "No one could possibly predict was upcoming for Manford" has grammatical issues and misses an opportunity to foreshadow the cyclical storms that become central to the plot.

Exemplar: The citizens of Manford continued their daily routines as storm clouds gathered overhead, unaware that this was merely the beginning of a curse that would soon devastate their town—a curse that only Raymond, a homeless man huddled in an alleyway, would eventually understand.

#2: The dream sequence

Strengths: Your use of dreams as a plot device effectively provides direction to the protagonist. It creates an intriguing supernatural element to the story.

Weakness: Underdeveloped motivation \rightarrow The dream sequence feels rushed and lacks emotional impact. You mention Raymond's mind was "fuzzy" from hunger, but don't explore how this affects his decision to trust the dream. The voice in the dream gives instructions without explaining why Raymond was chosen or what the "eye of the temple of time" is.

Exemplar: After five weeks of increasingly violent storms, Raymond collapsed from exhaustion behind the remnants of the old church. In his dreams, a shimmering figure appeared before him and spoke with ancient wisdom: "You alone can sense our warning. Find the Eye of the Temple of Time hidden within the Whispering Woods, for only there can the storm cycle be broken."

#3: Resolution

Strengths: You've included a satisfying conclusion where Raymond succeeds in his mission and gains respect from the townspeople who initially doubted him.

Weakness: Rushed ending \rightarrow The ending is abrupt and lacks details about how Raymond actually completed his mission. You mention finding "the centre of the temple of winds" (which differs from the earlier "eye of the temple of time"), but don't describe what happened there, how he stopped the storms, or what challenges he faced in the final stage of his quest.

Exemplar: After seven days of treacherous travel with his wolf companion, Raymond finally reached the ancient Temple of Winds. Standing before the massive stone Eye at its centre, he remembered the instructions from his dream and placed his hands upon the carved surface. The Eye began to glow with an unearthly blue light, absorbing the darkness that had cursed Manford's skies. As the final storm clouds dissipated above him, Raymond knew his mission was complete.

Your piece has a promising foundation with an interesting premise about recurring storms and a quest to save a town. The relationship between Raymond and the wolf shows your ability to develop meaningful connections between characters. However, the narrative would benefit from more consistent pacing and detailed descriptions of important scenes.

Also, the quest itself needs more obstacles and challenges to create tension. Currently, finding and helping the wolf is the main hurdle, but additional complications would make Raymond's journey more compelling. The resolution feels particularly rushed, leaving readers without the satisfaction of experiencing how Raymond actually completes his quest.

When revising, focus on expanding the final scenes where Raymond reaches the temple and overcomes whatever challenges await him there. Additionally, consider adding more details about the temple itself and why it controls the storms.

Section 2:
