Section 1:

#1 - Opening paragraph establishing character and setting

Strengths: Your opening effectively introduces Achilles and his relationship with his soccer ball, creating immediate sympathy for the character. The metaphor comparing him to a "wilted flower" and then correcting to "weed" shows thoughtful word choice.

Weakness: Inconsistent narrative flow \rightarrow The paragraph jumps between different ideas without smooth connections. You move from "Achilles kicked the ball" to explaining his friendship with the ball, then to school bullying, then back to his walk home. The sentence "He knew that as soon as that school bell rang, the boys in the school would tease and mock him until he was a wilted flower" feels disconnected from the soccer ball introduction.

Exemplar: After school, Achilles would kick his soccer ball around the empty field, knowing it was his only true companion. Once the morning bell rang, the boys at school would tease and mock him relentlessly.

#2 - Dialogue between Achilles and his mother

Strengths: The dialogue feels natural and shows the caring relationship between mother and son. Your use of the Portuguese accent detail adds character depth.

Weakness: Unclear character responses → The conversation lacks realistic development and pacing. When Achilles says "Nothing, ma, nothing" but then immediately "blurted out all the things in less than a minute," it doesn't match how people actually speak during difficult conversations. The transition from denial to full confession happens too quickly.

Exemplar: "Nothing, ma, nothing," Achilles replied, but when his mother's gentle eyes met his, the words came tumbling out about the boys who had been tormenting him.

#3 - Climactic confrontation scene

Strengths: Your dialogue in the final confrontation shows character growth, and Achilles' declaration demonstrates his newfound courage. The resolution feels satisfying.

Weakness: Abrupt character transformation \rightarrow Achilles changes from a frightened victim to a confident speaker too suddenly without showing the internal journey. The line "I may be small, but I have a mighty heart!" appears without any build-up or internal struggle being shown.

Exemplar: Taking a deep breath and remembering his mother's words, Achilles stood taller. "I may be small, but I won't let you stop me from pursuing my dreams anymore."

■ Your piece tells an engaging story about overcoming bullying with a clear beginning, middle, and end. The character of Achilles is relatable, and readers will connect with his struggles. However, your story would benefit from smoother transitions between scenes and more gradual character development. Additionally, you could strengthen the middle section by showing more of Achilles' internal thoughts and feelings. The dialogue between characters works well, but some conversations need more realistic pacing. Your ending provides a satisfying resolution, though it would be more powerful if you showed Achilles' growing confidence throughout the story rather than having it appear suddenly. Also, consider adding more specific details about the school setting and the bullies to help readers visualise the scenes better.
