Strengths: Your opening creates immediate tension and urgency. The comparison of your heart to a drum helps readers understand the character's fear.

Weakness: Punctuation and spacing errors → Your writing lacks proper spacing after commas and full stops, which makes it difficult to read smoothly. For example, "heavy,powerful footsteps" should have a space after the comma, and "behind me,and" needs spacing. These errors interrupt the flow of your exciting opening.

Exemplar: *"Thud! Thud! Thud! The heavy, powerful footsteps were just behind me, and every step felt like a step towards death."*

#2 *"I blearily opened my eyes,and as i did,the shock of what had happened rebounded ,the horror of what had happened in the last few hours crashing down on me like a bucket of icy water."*

Strengths: Your simile about icy water effectively shows how shocking the memories feel. You successfully show the character's confusion about time.

Weakness: Run-on sentence structure → This sentence tries to express too many ideas at once without proper breaks, making it confusing to follow. The phrase "what had happened" appears twice, creating unnecessary repetition that weakens your writing's impact.

Exemplar: *"I blearily opened my eyes. As I did, the shock rebounded—the horror of recent events crashed down on me like a bucket of icy water."*

#3 *"Without saying a word,she grabbed my hand and a piece of floor slid away to reveal a ladder that led down into a tunnel.Without thinking,I scrambled down the ladder and set off into the tunnel."*

Strengths: Your action moves quickly, creating excitement. The mysterious sliding floor adds intrigue to your story.

Weakness: Choppy pacing and unclear transitions → Your sentences feel rushed and don't give readers time to picture what's happening. The connection between Emmy grabbing the

character's hand and the floor sliding away isn't clear, leaving readers confused about how these events relate.

Exemplar: *"Without saying a word, she grabbed my hand and pressed something on the wall. Suddenly, a piece of floor slid away, revealing a ladder that led down into a dark tunnel."*

■ Your adventure story shows good imagination and creates exciting moments that keep readers interested. The escape plot and mysterious characters like Emmy add intrigue to your narrative. However, your writing needs stronger connections between ideas and clearer explanations of how events unfold. Additionally, you should focus on fixing punctuation and spacing errors that make your writing harder to read. Your story jumps between scenes quite quickly, which can confuse readers about what's happening and why. To improve your writing, spend more time explaining how one event leads to the next, and slow down in some parts to help readers picture the scenes clearly. Also, try reading your work aloud to catch spacing and punctuation mistakes that interrupt the flow.
