## **Section 1:**

#1 - Opening paragraph and build-up to the match

**Strengths:** Your piece effectively creates anticipation through James' long wait and dreams about the match. The connection between his soccer performance and earning this reward shows good character motivation.

Weakness: Unclear timeline and confusing sequence → The opening mentions "A few weeks ago, James had already been waiting" which creates confusion about when events are happening. The phrase "already been waiting" suggests he was waiting before the few weeks ago, making the timeline muddled. Additionally, jumping from thunder to backstory without clear transitions makes the narrative flow awkward.

Exemplar: Three weeks before the match, James began his eager wait for what would become the most valuable experience of his young life.

#2 - Family sacrifice and economic context

**Strengths:** Your writing shows empathy by including the family's financial struggles and parents' hard work. This adds emotional depth and makes James' disappointment more meaningful.

Weakness: Repetitive sentence structure and vague descriptions → Many sentences follow the same pattern of "James did this" or "He wanted that," creating monotonous rhythm. Phrases like "worked through nights and long, stressful weeks of tiredness" are wordy without adding specific detail about what the parents actually did for work or how they saved money.

Exemplar: His parents, both working extra shifts at the local factory, had saved every spare dollar for months to afford the tickets.

#3 - Stadium atmosphere and weather description

**Strengths:** Your piece uses sensory details like the crowd sounds and grey clouds to create atmosphere. The contrast between the excitement and gloomy weather builds tension effectively.

Weakness: Mixed metaphors and awkward comparisons → The writing combines musical metaphors (orchestra, choir, music performance) inconsistently throughout the piece. The phrase "bright with all the fans bringing everything together" doesn't clearly explain how fans create brightness, and "Grey clouds hovered over the area" is too vague about the location.

Exemplar: Despite the overcast sky, the stadium buzzed with energy as thousands of supporters filled the stands with their colourful scarves and chants.

■ Your piece demonstrates good storytelling instincts with a clear beginning, middle, and disappointing end followed by hope. The emotional journey of James waiting, being disappointed, then getting a second chance creates a satisfying narrative arc. However, your writing would benefit from clearer sentence construction and more specific details. Instead of saying James "jumped around enthusiastically," describe exactly what he did - perhaps he practiced his team's chants or wore his lucky jersey. Also, focus on varying your sentence beginnings to avoid the repetitive "James did" pattern. Additionally, when describing the family's financial situation, include concrete details like specific jobs or how long they saved. Your use of weather to reflect mood shows good literary awareness, but make sure your metaphors stay consistent throughout the piece. The ending provides nice closure with the rematch opportunity, showing James's resilience.
