## **Section 1:**

**Strengths:** Your opening creates an atmospheric setting with sensory details like "vibrant stalls overflowing with colour and aroma." You've established an intriguing contrast between the usual cheerful marketplace and the current stormy atmosphere.

Weakness: Unclear spatial description → The phrase "lying in a couple of cozy nooks" doesn't make logical sense, as one person cannot lie in multiple locations simultaneously. Additionally, "stalls...occupied with chuckles" creates confusion about whether the stalls themselves or the people are chuckling.

Exemplar: Felix woke in a cozy nook beside the town square, rubbing slumber and bewilderment from his eyes. The vibrant stalls that usually overflowed with colour, aroma, and cheerful chatter now stood eerily quiet.

#2 - Animal communication scene: "Just then, a small voice was heard behind him. It was Pip, the cranky sparrow who preferred to sit on Felix's shoulder. 'Felix! The animals need you!' Pip fluttered around him in distressed circles."

**Strengths:** You've introduced Felix's special ability naturally through dialogue and shown Pip's personality through the description "cranky sparrow." The urgency comes through clearly in Pip's distressed behaviour.

Weakness: Passive voice construction → Using "a small voice was heard" creates distance between the reader and the action. This passive construction weakens the immediacy of the moment when active voice would be more engaging.

Exemplar: A small voice piped up behind him. Pip, the cranky sparrow who preferred to sit on Felix's shoulder, fluttered around him in distressed circles. "Felix! The animals need you!"

#3 - Resolution paragraph: "And as they strolled back into town paw-in-hand (or boy-in-dog, more accurately), sunlight began breaking through once more—a promise of sunnier days yet to come wrapped snugly around their hearts like an unbreakable tie of friends forevermore."

**Strengths:** Your ending brings hope and resolution with the imagery of sunlight breaking through. The friendship theme is reinforced nicely with the walking together scene.

Weakness: Convoluted sentence structure → The parenthetical correction "(or boy-in-dog, more accurately)" interrupts the flow awkwardly, and the final metaphor becomes tangled with multiple comparisons layered together, making it difficult to follow.

Exemplar: As they strolled back into town together, sunlight began breaking through the clouds once more—a promise that brighter days lay ahead, sealed by their unbreakable friendship.

■ Your piece demonstrates creativity and imagination in developing Felix's character and his special gift. The story has a clear beginning, middle, and end with a satisfying rescue plot. However, your writing would benefit from clearer, more direct sentences that don't confuse readers. Also, some paragraphs contain ideas that could be separated for better flow. Additionally, you should focus on making each sentence say exactly what you mean—avoid phrases that don't make sense when read carefully. Your dialogue works well to show character relationships, but the descriptive passages sometimes become unclear with too many ideas packed together. Furthermore, checking each sentence to ensure it describes what actually happens will strengthen your storytelling. You have good instincts for creating atmosphere and showing friendship, which are important skills for any writer.
