#1 *"The first crash of thunder silenced the crowd. Time stood frozen. Thousands of people stared at the sky in unison, their breaths stuck in their throats."*

Strengths: Your opening creates immediate tension and sets a dramatic scene. The short, punchy sentences work well to build suspense.

Weakness: Unclear Setting Development → Your piece jumps straight into action without helping readers understand where they are. You mention "the crowd" and later "the stadium" but don't establish this is a sporting event until much later. Phrases like "thousands of people stared at the sky" leave readers confused about the location and context.

Exemplar: *"Thunder crashed above the packed football stadium, silencing the cheering crowd instantly."*

#2 *"5 years ago, his mum and him sat on the very seats, were his mum had givin him his ticket saying, 'When the thunder unleashes it's lethal power, follow the coordinates.'"*

Strengths: You effectively use flashback to provide important background information. The mysterious message from Jack's mother adds intrigue to the story.

Weakness: Confusing Sentence Structure → This sentence tries to pack too much information together, making it hard to follow. The phrase "sat on the very seats, were his mum had givin him his ticket" creates confusion because it's unclear what "the very seats" refers to and the grammar doesn't flow properly.

Exemplar: *"Five years earlier, Jack and his mum had sat in these same stadium seats when she gave him the ticket with her mysterious message."*

#3 *"As he pressed on of the unknown buttons, a burst of emerald green flames shout out of the end of the remote. It expanded into a hole, bubbling like nuclear waste."*

Strengths: Your use of specific colours like "emerald green" helps readers visualise the scene. The comparison to "nuclear waste" creates an effective scary image.

Weakness: Inconsistent Action Description → Your description of what happens jumps around confusingly. You mention flames that "shout out" then suddenly describe "a hole, bubbling like nuclear waste" without explaining how flames became a hole or what's actually happening.

Exemplar: *"When Jack pressed one of the buttons, emerald green flames shot from the remote, quickly forming into a bubbling portal that reminded him of dangerous chemicals."*

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Your piece shows creativity and imagination, particularly with the mysterious elements like the hidden coordinates and the magical remote. You've created an interesting character in Jack and set up an intriguing mystery about his missing mother. However, your story needs clearer organisation and smoother connections between ideas. Many sentences try to say too much at once, making them confusing to read. Additionally, you need to help readers understand the setting better from the beginning - it's not clear this is happening at a sporting event until partway through. Also, some parts of your story move too quickly without proper explanation, like when Jack finds the remote and it suddenly creates a portal. To improve your writing, focus on one main idea per sentence and make sure each paragraph connects smoothly to the next. Consider explaining important details more clearly so readers can follow along easily.
